Reassessment period

Teaching Block 2 reassessments and Teaching Block 3 assessments will take place from **Monday 2 August - Friday 13 August**. The resit coursework deadline is **Tuesday 3 August**.

If you need to resit or resubmit a piece of work, you do not need to apply - the process is automatic. If you need a resit or a retake and have not been previously capped, [your mark will not be capped](#).

Support during resits

Unlike the main assessment period, you are not able to request a Five Working Day Extension for coursework, so it's important to understand what options are available to you.

To increase the number of vaccines being delivered in Bristol and across the region, the Exhibition and Conference Centre (ECC) on Frenchay campus is now home to a coronavirus vaccination centre!

It has capacity for up to 1000 vaccinations a day and free parking is available, accessible via the North Entrance, with extra bus services being put on.
