During her early England career, she balanced life as a Secondary school PE teacher and elite rugby player. Not only evident on the rugby pitch, Amber's desire to help and support others also shines is her life off the pitch. She is a positive role model to all and continues to demonstrate to others that anything is possible. A strong advocate for the Bristol Bears community foundation projects, Amber actively supports the team in promoting health, well-being and physical activity to girls in the city.
